Nelson Arturo OVALLE DIAZ is a Colombian lawyer (Free University - Colombia). He obtained a master's degree in Management (University of Saint-Thomas - Colombia). He also received a master's degree in International Law (University of Ottawa - Canada). Finally, Professor OVALLE DIAZ was awarded a Doctor of Laws degree (University of Ottawa - Canada) in 2015.

Dr. Nelson Arturo OVALLE DIAZ is currently a professor at the Universities of Saint Paul and Ottawa (Canada). He teaches several courses on the relationship between law and social sciences.

Research interests, of Professor OVALLE DIAZ, include legal theory, anthropology and legal sociology, comparative law, international law, constitutional law, transitional justice, social economy, social justice, human rights, public policy with an emphasis on criminal policy, alternative dispute resolution mechanisms, and international cooperation. Professor OVALLE DIAZ is also an expert in the creation and functioning of national and transnational legal entities (NGOs, think tanks, social enterprises, cooperatives, trade unions, social organizations, non-profit and charitable organizations, etc.).
